

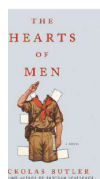
Eleanor Oliphant is Completely Fine

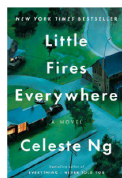
The Wanderers

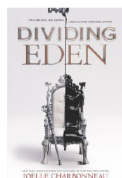
Best Day Ever

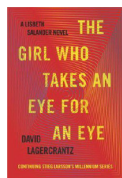
Before We Were Yours

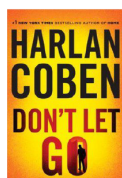
Dividing Eden

When their father and older sibling are killed by assassins, a pair of royal twins who were never destined to rule are forced to compete against each other in a dangerous trial.



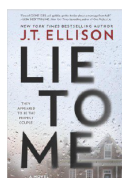
Dear Fahrenheit 451
