




by A. J. Sass


Twelve-year-old figure skater Ana strives to win competitions while learning about gender identity--Ana's own and that of a new friend--and how to navigate the best path forward.

by Maleeha Siddiqui






### Huda F Are You?


girl. Huda is lost in a sea of hijabis, & she can't rely on her hijab to define her. She has to define herself.

by 1965- Gansworth, Eric


The Native American author recounts the story of his family, from the legacy of government boarding schools to his personal experiences fighting to be an artist balancing multiple worlds.

by The Kao


