by Neal Shusterman




High school junior Del Rainey unwittingly joins a Purity Pledge class at church, hoping to get closer to his long-term crush, Kiera.




Tokyo Ever After



bonding with friends over erotic gay fanfiction, and facing the trauma and fundamental violation of pap smears.




Elatsoe
