## YEAR IN REVIEW

#### Thank you for staying connected with us.

s the fiscal year began, our community found itself in an unprecedented situation. Still in the midst of a global pandemic, we found our footing as mask wearing and other protocols became commonplace. Remote learning and working were the new normal.

At the Park Ridge Library, our patron services staff was making plans to safely get materials to patrons following guidance of a nationwide study.\* As more programs were adapted to a virtual format, our Adult and Reader Services teams connected with patrons via Zoom for book discussions and lifelong learning. Our Youth Services team offered early literacy through virtual storytimes, interactive Fun on the Run kits and corresponding virtual programs. During the school year, they offered homework support for remote learners and educators. Throughout the year, you, our patrons, stayed connected with us through supportive emails and voicemails, messages sent via Live Chat, or by participating in one of our virtual programs.

The timeline below illustrates the many ways Library staff and administration pivoted based on the advice of public health officials to continue to bring the Library to the community and connect with patrons.



#### **A COMMUNITY OF SUPPORTERS**

The **2021 Library Award** was presented to the Sitkiewicz family for their ongoing Marion's Mark initiative. Marion's Mark plans to provide Little Free Libraries throughout the community at six residential locations in Park Ridge. Installation of Little Free Libraries was delayed due to the pandemic and the project will move forward in 2021.

**The Friends of the Library** hosted an ongoing book sale in the Library's Quiet Reading room and have since re-established their Book Nook on the second floor. *We are grateful for their continued support.*

### FINANCIAL OUTLOOK

A the October 20, 2020 Park Ridge Public Library Board of Trustees meeting, the Library Board approved the alignment of the Library's fiscal year to the calendar year. This resolution agrees with the City of Park Ridge's amendment to the Municipal Code, which establishes a new fiscal year commencing on January 1, 2022. The Library is currently operating in a stub year from May 1 – December 31, 2021 to prepare for the fiscal adjustment. Amidst these changes, the Library continues to deficit spend toward a 6-month reserve target.

#### **Budget Assumptions**

To maintain FY22-level operations with adjustments due to minimum wage legislation, the Library Board is developing a comprehensive assessment of financial requirements for the Library Board's 2021 levy resolution. The Library Board is also taking into account the impacts of the pandemic and its potential effects on the tax levy.



#### FY2022 Assumptions for City Services

The SY2021 budget includes the assumption that the City of Park Ridge will continue to provide the following services to Park Ridge Public Library. The Library Board assumes in its statement of financial requirements for FY2022 that these will remain unchanged for FY2022.

- Administers and pays employer contributions for IMRF and FICA taxes for each Library employee
- Administers and pays for Library insurance coverage for excess workers compensation, employee accident, public liability (all City board and commissions), and excess liability and property insurance for the Library building and City parking lot adjacent to the Library
- Provides general banking for co-mingled funds in operating account only; provides check printing services and financial accounting software
- Provides general human resources support including maintenance of official personnel records of Library employees
- Processes payroll of Library employees including software licensing fees for payroll software
- Administers employee benefits program including health, dental, vision, life insurance, 457 plans and employee assistant program
- Includes Library in City gas and electric utilities franchise agreements as well as any other benefits the City received to the extent permitted by such franchises and applicable law
- Waives costs for water and sewer services
- Administers and pays for garbage removal
- Maintains City Commons (grounds surrounding Library building) including but not limited to: the drainage system, landscaping, fence and planters
- Provides snow removal services in City parking lot adjacent to the Library and public sidewalks including Library staff parking area
- Provides maintenance, gas and insurance for the Library van (replacement would be purchased by Library)

- Changes in service may need to be addressed with a budget transfer/amendment by one or both of the organizations involved.
- 2. Fiscal year 2021 financial information remains subject to audit.
- 3. There are no outstanding liabilities from FY2021.


