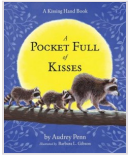

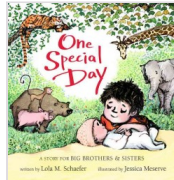

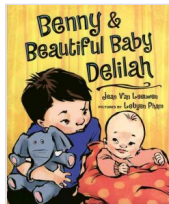

Green on Green

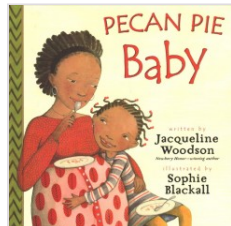

Poppy's Best Babies

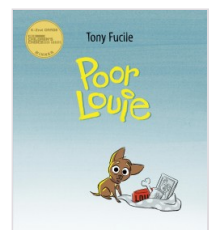

A devoted little dog becomes alarmed when his routine changes: double sets of new furniture and clothing begin showing up, and his mom's tummy gets bafflingly larger.

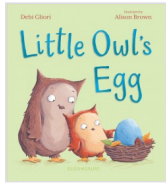

Feeling apprehensive when he learns that a new sibling is expected, a young owl imagines what kind of animal might hatch from his mommy's egg.

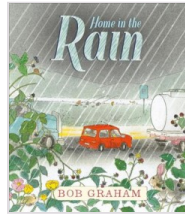

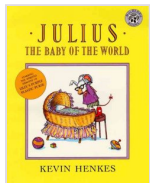
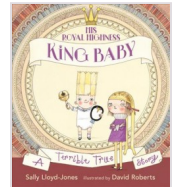
Home in the Rain

Waiting out a storm, a little girl and her mother write the names of family members on their car's fogged-up windows before they are inspired to name a soon-to-be-born baby sister.



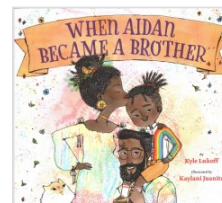
His Royal Highness, King Baby

Aidan, a transgender boy, experiences complicated emotions as he and his parents prepare for the arrival of a new baby.

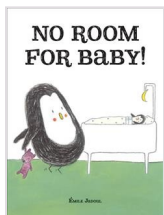
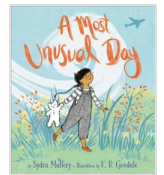
Mama's Belly

A little girl expresses curiosity and excitement for the coming birth of her baby sister while her parents tenderly reassure her of love's ability to expand with their growing family.



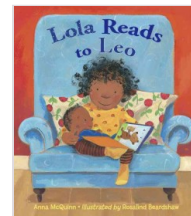

New big sister Lola can't wait to share her love of reading with baby Leo, and even though Mommy and Daddy are busy, they still have time to read to Lola at bedtime.

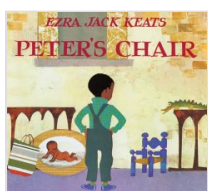
Little Big Girl

Enjoying big adventures in spite of her small size, a little girl meets her new baby sibling and discovers that she is not so small after all.



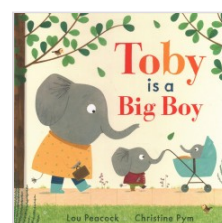
Loretta's Gift
