

Services will have more time to look up materials, troubleshoot and place items on hold. We are still at the desk ready to engage with patrons and show them the new technology!" The front desk will be staffed at all times, just as before. Checkout stations will be opening this summer on the second floor lobby and in Children's Services

The checkout stations allow a small stack of up to six books to be scanned at a time. And, the system works with Keyring, an app that allows users to store their library card barcode on their phone. The new checkout machines will read the barcode on a library card, but patrons will no longer be able to use their photo ID to look up their card number. The \$1 fee for a replacement card will be waived June through August.

The new return stations are flat screens on the wall near the front desk, where a computer scans materials, a conveyer belt pulls them in and they are sorted into bins by collection. Behind the scenes, staff can focus on the more detailed sort for items to be shelved. A public seating area is now in the space where the return desk once was.

In addition to new equipment enhancing experience, patrons can now sign up for Library programs and events using new registration software called LibCal. Patrons will be able to register multiple guests at once, receive automatic e-mail reminders and easily add events to their personal online or smartphone calendar.

Patrons will also benefit from all new computers throughout the library with installation beginning in June 2019.
